An Englishman's home is his converted flat

he continuing shortage of new homes - with UK households growing at twice the rate of new home builds - has prompted a slew of recent government measures aimed at stimulating supply and demand. Some see positive signs in the housing market but is it enough?

Ministers will hope that the success of the initial phase of their Help to Buy scheme will be replicated as it is expanded to cover £130 billion of mortgages from January next year. Critics pointed out that the Help to Buy scheme is addressing a problem the UK does not have - too few people wanting to buy a new home. If Help to Buy does not do anything directly for housing supply then, the argument goes, cheaper lending will just stoke up demand closely followed by prices. Right on cue from RICS came evidence of almost UK wide house price increases and the argument appeared complete - if completely circumstantial.


Demand-side initiatives such as Help to Buy and a general easing of the credit environment are likely to help confidence on the housing supply side. Solid evidence of supply side growth came with the NHBC's 2013 Q2 figures for new housing registrations - up nearly 40 per cent on last year at around 68,000 for the half year. This was just one of a number of recently published forecasts and indices that have prompted construction industry calls to "prepare for growth".

If the magnitude of growth in new house registrations

and completions continues in the second half of this year, 2013 is on track to build over 130,000 new homes. Double digit growth on last year! This would be much more welcome were it not for the chasm remaining in the number of homes that we should be building. Even if the UK achieves 15 per cent growth, it will still remain half the growth our population growth needs and around a third of the number built across the Channel in France.

A cultural shift may be required. Indeed France - along with most of the rest of Europe - deliver 60 per cent of their new housing total as self or single custom builds. The self-build sector represents only around 10 per cent of the housing market in the UK. Matching European selfbuild levels could totally transform the UK's new housing position. On the face of it, the huge headroom for growth in self and custom build in the UK represents a real policy opportunity for government and a huge revenue opportunity for the construction industry.

Over half of all new housing plans in the UK are for single units. But they remain dwarfed in terms of unit numbers by the large housing schemes - or as Grand Design's Kevin McCloud labels some: "identikit Noddy houses built at the lowest possible cost". Measures to stimulate the sector appear half hearted and piecemeal. The government did invest £30 million schemes to assist self and custom build back in 2011. More recently the easing of planning controls on residential conversions

caused a small spike in applications for single build and smaller conversion projects. And finally funding has been announced to help 'Community Right to Build Orders', which could pave the way for self and custom build projects to sidestep most planning controls entirely - following a local referendum. Have these helped?

Planning Pipe's track of new single build planning applications in 2013 does show some growth - both on last year and quarter on quarter. But with single build conversions, self and custom build projects still numbering less than 1,500 units a month, the huge growth potential that self and custom builds represent is stuck in policy theory - rather than near term political reality.

The major blockage to growth in this sector is generally seen to be the availability and cost of land, with insufficient controls and incentives to stimulate non-speculative, self build or custom builds. Significant regulatory and cultural reform would be required to actually deliver the potential that self and custom build offers to the UK. But that potential is there despite the much publicised (and overstated) "shortage of space" particularly across the South East. Alex Morton's excellent Policy Exchange paper A Right to Build details some of the possibilities. For the development community it is also argued that if more people in the UK built their own homes, more people would feel more positive towards new home building by developers. A win-win?

Detached homes made up 40 per cent of all homes built before 2,000. It is perhaps no surprise that in 2013 flats now dominate new house building types - with more than twice as many flats or maisonettes built now than the once-dominant detached house. "An Englishman's home is his converted flat" is not representative of the gender or motivation of the reported six million UK inhabitants interested in self or custom build. But this huge latent demand to buy and be more involved in the designing and building of one's own home seems badly served by government, planners and indeed the construction industry. The tinkering of controls and incentives does not attack the vested interests of the landowning or development community. Change on a big scale requires political initiatives on a big scale. We still wait to see those on the horizon.

Sinclair Meadows: Achieving carbon negative status

n September 2012, Four Housing, a not-for-profit provider of social housing in north east of England in collaboration with the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA), South Tyneside Council, Groundwork South Tyneside and Newcastle and Galliford Try Partnerships North - welcomed residents to Sinclair Meadows, the UK's first carbon negative social housing estate.

Sinclair Meadows has gone on to win numerous regional and national awards, including Best Affordable Housing Scheme at the Housing Excellence Awards. Dawn Keightley, group director of operations at Four Housing, describes the technologies used to help the development achieve carbon negative status.

The development was designed and built to surpass the government's definition of zero carbon and to exceed the minimum requirement for Level 6 of the Code for Sustainable Homes.

The development is home to one of the largest collections of solar panels on domestic dwellings in the UK. The roofs of the 21 homes are decked with 85kW peak photovoltaic array solar panels, which reduce demand on traditional energy resources and export any excess energy back to the grid.

The project has also focused on the

quality of the building fabric throughout, particularly in terms of air tightness and heat loss. Air tightness strategies and quality checks throughout construction ensured that the buildings had been sealed to prevent unwanted air movements, draughts and heat loss. The buildings have achieved an air-tightness level of 1.6m3/m2/hr@50pa compared to a standard Building Regulation requirement of 10m3/m2/hr@50pa.

A community biomass boiler uses recycled wood pellets to power the hot water and heating systems. Furthermore, heat recovery systems minimise heat loss and repurpose what has already been released into the environment and the underground rainwater harvesting system collects rain water which is used to flush toilets.

The properties have been built using natural materials wherever possible, such as timber frames, recycled wood insulation and a natural render system. Throughout their growing cycle, these materials have absorbed massive amounts of CO2 which is then locked into the development for the life of the buildings.

Once the development has reached the end of its useful life, the majority of the materials will be reusable, recyclable and biodegradable.

Each unit at Sinclair Meadows exceeds the 2013 zero carbon definition by 10.66 Kg/CO₂/m² per year, the equivalent of 16.96 tonnes of CO₂. This achievement in itself cements the long term prospects of the development and within 2.8 years of creation, Sinclair Meadows will wipe out its own carbon footprint created as a result of its construction.



Tough times ahead... in the run-up to the next election

he next general election is just under two years away but already we are seeing housing issues feature in the early sparring between politicians, as they compete for our votes.

Showing off their debt reduction credentials the Conservatives have started planning the next set of welfare reforms and benefit cuts, while the Lib Dems and Labour are focusing more on how to deliver the building of a million more homes. Many housing professionals are already feeling hard-pressed and wondering how they will cope with the politicians' plans for change.

From July the maximum amount of benefits that families can receive was set at £500 a week or £26,000 a year, regardless of the number of children they have. Initially the cap only affects a relatively small number of people, but its principle has now been established and Treasury officials are looking at lowering the cap possibly to just £20,000 – which would impact on significantly more families.

The benefit cap will be rolled out across the country from September, but government research on the pilots in four London boroughs showed approximately 10 per cent of claimant families losing over £200 a week.

Meanwhile an estimated 600,000 tenants of housing associations and councils are now liable for the new 'bedroom tax', which cuts their housing benefit by £14 a week where they have a spare bedroom, rising to £25 for two or more spare bedrooms.

Their only options are to move to smaller accommodation, or to stay put and pay the shortfall or not pay the difference and run the risk of eviction. Research from the Chartered Institute of Housing has found that many tenants are trapped in their homes, as there are insufficient one- and two-bedroom properties available for them to move into.

Government plans to continue with the cuts were further boosted at the end of July when a legal challenge to the bedroom tax by 10 families with a disabled member, failed in its attempt to have the benefit cuts ruled as discriminatory.

As the direct payment of housing benefit to landlords is phased out, more tenants will become solely responsible for paying their rent. The temptation to pay other bills ahead of their rent will be too great for many tenants – with rent arrears and debts set to increase dramatically. It is also feared more people will be driven to borrow expensively from payday loan companies or loan sharks, making their finances even more difficult to manage.

So far social landlords have been unwilling to evict large numbers of tenants for rent arrears. If this approach hardens and more evictions are sought, the attitudes of judges and the courts will be severely tested and there will be strain put on the relationship between landlords, their staff and tenants.

Safety fears were further increased when staff at one London housing association were shot at in the Summer when they arrived at a property to carry out what was thought to be a straightforward eviction for rent arrears.

At the other end of the spectrum the economy is showing early signs of edging its way towards a recovery, but already some experts are warning us the housing market is in danger of repeating problems of the past.

Mortgage lending increased sharply in May to July and is at levels not seen since October 2008; house sales are on the up and average prices are rising across all parts of the country and not just in the overheated London market. But the construction sector is unable to keep up with demand for new homes despite the significant reduction in planning rules and guidance.

The Chancellor's initiative to stimulate the

housing market, called Help To Buy (which guarantees mortgages for purchases up to £600,000), has managed to unite the Institute of Directors, the CIH and the Nat Fed, with Vince Cable and Sir Mervyn King in branding it as "dangerous". They fear it will drive up prices without stimulating any extra building of new homes.

Last year starts were made on fewer than 100,000 new homes – less than half the number needed to keep up with demand.

Independent economist Kate Barker previously warned us that a million new homes are needed just to plug the historic gap between demand and supply.

The National Housing Federation recently highlighted the impact of these shortfalls, by reporting that 3.7 million young adults will be living with their parents in 2020, as the rate of new housebuilding fails to keep up with demand. And in the meantime local authority waiting lists exceed two million families and there is evidence of thousands of back garden sheds being used as accommodation in west London, Reading and Slough.

Many housing associations and councils are keen to fill the gap in housing supply but are struggling to do this in the current operating environment.

Local authorities wishing to build new homes are finding their plans in need of a major re-think as the government has signalled an end to the planned convergence of housing association and council rents. This has put a significant dent in their financial plans, making the building of new council homes unaffordable.

Housing associations are also facing their own set of problems with falling grant rates, the unpopularity of affordable rents (at up to 80 per cent of market rents), planning uncertainties, concerns about weaknesses in their regulation and lenders wanting to re-price their loans and lend at higher interest rates. Will only the largest of HAs be able to develop in this climate or will even they reject this just as many have said 'No' to the Green Deal?

The housing sector's regulator, the Homes and Community Agency, recently attracted some unwelcome attention by admitting it has not downgraded the financial viability ratings of housing associations it has serious concerns about. HCA regulation committee chair Julian Ashby explained he did not want to make matters worse for these landlords by giving their lenders the excuse to re-price their loans.

Meanwhile the HCA is recruiting a new director to lead on its regulatory activities. It is understood a major part of their work between now and May 2015 will be reviewing the current regime and coming up with regulatory changes in time for the general election.

Politicians in the next two years will be demanding the housing sector delivers more efficiencies, more savings and more homes. Housing professionals will be asking themselves can they do this without undermining their core business of providing high quality homes and services to their tenants, while also coping with the welfare reforms.

SITE SCREENING

ADAS launches free ecological site screening service

gricultural and environmental consultancy, ADAS, has launched a free ecological site screening service for house builders and developers, which will assist with the planning process and help to reduce the risk of unnecessary delays and costs associated with ecological issues.

Construction professionals can now visit a specialist microsite (http://ecology.adas.co.uk) to submit key information and receive a free-of-charge ecological appraisal within 48 hours* of the initial enquiry.

ADAS decided to launch the free ecological site screening service due to increased activity in the housing market and interest from house builders to reinvigorate land banks and invest in new sites; both of which will benefit from an early ecological appraisal to identify potential issues.

Commenting on the launch of the free ecological site screening service and the new microsite, Jon Abbatt, head of environment at ADAS, said: "Developing a site can be costly and time consuming if potential ecological issues are not identified and addressed from the outset.

"ADAS' free ecological appraisals mean construction professionals are able to identify these issues in the very early stages of the site planning and development process. Getting a clear idea of the costs involved and time needed when



developing a particular site is essential and if any potential problems are discovered, we can then work with the developers to find a solution."

To receive a free ecological site screening, house builders, developers and other construction professionals are asked to specify the red line boundaries of their site on an aerial map already provided by ADAS via the microsite.

Within two working days, ADAS' ecological consultants will return the appraisal highlighting ecological constraints, potential risks and designations.

David Randall, senior landscape architect at Bradley Murphy Design, said: "Within an hour of submitting details to the website, I had received a call from a senior ecologist who outlined the potential ecological constraints likely to affect redevelopment of the site. They advised us of the level of ecological risk to the development, and made recommendations..."

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Officers recommend approval for CABE endorsed Olympic legacy scheme

London Legacy Development Corporation planning committee has recommended approval for Chobham Farm, a new family neighbourhood designed for East Thames and London and Continental Railways by Pollard Thomas Edwards architects.

PTEa was first appointed in 2008 by the East Thames Group to prepare an outline masterplan in support of its detailed application for a site on Leyton Road. The design has evolved over the years in consultation with LB Newham, the ODA (now the LLDC), GLA and CABE.

Chobham Farm is located to the east of the Olympic Village between Leyton Road and Westfield Stratford City. It is one of the important areas highlighted for redevelopment in the London Borough of Newham's Stratford Metropolitan Masterplan, with the potential to integrate the existing communities of Stratford New Town with new post-Olympic neighbourhoods.


In addition to facing the predominantly high-rise flats of the East Village to the West and the low-rise post-war terraces and flats of Stratford New Town to the East, the site has variations in ground level of up to two storeys, and railway lines on two sides.

The high-quality development will deliver around 1,000 homes, together with attractive new parks, squares and open space for local communities to enjoy. The proposals will also provide community spaces, opportunities for local businesses, and shops. Its sustainability is addressed in terms of mix, integration and energy, with connection to the Olympic Park District Energy Scheme (OPDES) envisaged, in addition to on-site PV and extensive SUDS measures.

The combination of home zone streets of houses with relatively modest five to eight storey apartment blocks around a new park, provides over 40 per cent family homes. All parking (except for wheelchair users) is accommodated in undercrofts that exploit existing level changes on site. The new park landscape at the heart of the proposals provides play space for all age groups, with all the new homes entered directly from the public realm.

A hybrid planning application for 1,036 homes, and up 8,000 sq m of commercial and community space, was unanimously approved. The first phase of 173 homes and 1,162 sq m of commercial space, which received detailed consent, is due to start on site in January.

Combining these physical characteristics with the principles of the Stratford Metropolitan Masterplan has produced a sheltered family neighbourhood that manages the transition in scale, invites pedestrian movement and suggests urban design precedents for the medium term

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
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First homes must cater to needs of new TV savvy generation

ore than half (52 per cent) of 18-34 year olds in the UK now expect access to a digital TV service as standard in their homes, seeing it as an everyday necessity, according to a nationwide survey. Our younger generations now see access to digital TV as more like a common utility, with only a quarter (26 per cent) of those surveyed still considering digital TV services a luxury in their home.

The survey of 2,000 people commissioned by Sky found that only 4 per cent of young people would now settle for just terrestrial TV in their new home, whereas a huge 78 per cent of people surveyed want access to a digital TV service.

Expectations do not stop at choice and quality of their digital TV, with this generation also demanding high levels of customer service. For 18-34 year olds, time is money and a significant 39 per cent of respondents would expect their digital TV service to be in and running within 48 hours. The vast majority of young people (81 per cent) would expect to have their digital TV service installed within seven days.

Brendan Hegarty, Head of Sky Communal TV, comments: "What we have here is a generation with different expectations from their parents and grandparents, fuelled by our rapidly evolving media landscape and consumption. Young people now expect a broader and more compelling choice of TV programming at their fingertips in their home and rightly so. It is our job, working together with landlords and property developers across the UK, to make sure that future generations of home owners and tenants receive the services they demand." Enq. 106

Blueprint wins national accolade

groundbreaking eco-housing development in Nottingham has scooped a prestigious national award for specialist regeneration developer Blueprint.

Green Street in the Meadows, 38 architectdesigned contemporary townhouses on the banks of the River Trent, has been named one



of the Best Residential Developments in the UK Property Awards.

Blueprint competed against a number of property development organisations for the national title.

Nick Ebbs, chief executive of Blueprint, said: "It's exciting to see Green Street getting national recognition. It's been outstandingly successful commercially, and it has proven that there is a healthy market for architect-designed, low energy homes. We are now applying this successful model to new projects in Nottingham and elsewhere."

Blueprint is among a number of winners who may go on to compete in the International Property Awards.

STUDENT ACCOMMODATION

Major student accommodation schemes get off the ground

wo high profile student accommodation schemes at King's College London and Manchester Metropolitan University (MMU) are finally underway. MMU have been recently named the greenest university in the UK and number one in the People and Planet League Table 2013 of 140 universities. The King's College London project will be BREEAM Outstanding. Combined, the schemes total over 1,600 units with frame being delivered onto site this month.

Despite being at opposite ends of the country the schemes share the same construction challenges, not least of all, operating to a strict build programme to ensure that both sites are occupied by students in September 2014.

Both developments are using Prestoplan Urban Advantage, a frame system designed to mitigate the risk of fire during construction but through its construction is designed to only require the application of one layer of 15mm plasterboard on site. This system results in a much faster and more efficient build, paving the way for follow on trades much more efficiently. While Urban Advantage has far reaching benefits during the construction phase, the acoustic and thermal performance properties of this evolved timber system will bring significant benefits to its occupants.

Ian Loughnane, Prestoplan managing director comments: "In terms of the benefits for students, timber frame, by virtue of the factory precise nature of its manufacture delivers high levels of thermal performance, Urban Advantage goes beyond that and delivers U-values as low as 0.2W/m2K. It's vital that we also address the acoustic challenge, suffice to say, students occupying this accommodation will sleep soundly despite what's going on down the corridor."

The development at Manchester Metropolitan University comprises 967 bedrooms, while the King's College London project totals just over 640. Both developments are following the same build programme.

Housing Design Award 2013 winners announced

1he 2013's Housing Design Awards have made more schemes winners than in any previous year, reflecting the improving quality of Britain's new housing. Thirtyseven completed schemes and 23 projects (unbuilt or partly built and not occupied) schemes were shortlisted, resulting in 15 Awards.

There are increasing signs of two parallel UK housing markets emerging - London and outside London - with more housing construction being concentrated in the capital. Well over half of all submissions to this year's Housing Design Awards were London schemes, a development that is reflected in the new Mayor' London Housing Design Guide award. Common design themes to emerge this year:

- Outside the capital there are a number of examples of high-quality schemes that have crafted an innovative contemporary response to the local rural vernacular.
- While still trying to meet higher densities, more developments are separating buildings with water.
- In order to build locally distinct housing estates, there are many instances of design variety, ranging from complexity of plans to the use of differing storey heights.

The Housing Design Awards are the longest running Awards programme in the country (since 1948) and the only one that sends a multidisciplinary set of judges to see shortlisted developments. Established and still controlled by government, this is the awards programme which all the others pretend to be.

David Birkbeck, CEO of Design for Homes, judge and 'rapporteur' for the government's Housing Design Awards says:

"It is great to see the number of winners increasing, reflecting the rise in standards of housing in the UK. I particularly congratulate Buccleuch House, Hackney, winner of two awards – a Project Award and the HAPPI Award."



Photorealism replacing architects' floor plans

omputer-generated images of new homes and apartments, and retail and office complexes surround us on our daily journeys through the city. They're often in newspaper and magazine adverts and on billboards placed by developers to inform the public, articulate ideas about placemaking, and ultimately to sell the space.

Now, a team of researchers from the Open University and Brunel University, London, has been studying the production of these images known as "architectural visualisations" used by architects, developers and planners for a £3.5 billion development in the centre of Doha, the capital city of Qatar.

Their findings, on show in a public exhibition in London this month, offer an insight into how computer generated images used in the Msheireb Downtown Project are part of a new wave of photorealism influencing the transformation of cities around the world. Digital visualisations of buildings and places once used in Hollywood movies, are now applied as crucial tools in architecture for imagining and designing new urban developments, and projecting what they feel like.

Geographer Prof. Gillian Rose from the OU, Dr Monica Degen, a sociologist from Brunel and research assistant Dr Clare Melhuish, an anthropologist and architectural journalist, have been following the international visualisation team working on the project, for two years. Professor Rose said that the visualisers had a different skill to the planners and architects and that their aim was to translate the architectural drawings into lively and atmospheric public spaces. "Some architects found the CGIs useful and others felt that because the visualisations were so glossy and photo-realistic that the client would judge their buildings on the basis of the images, and that the CGIs didn't do their work justice..."

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Insulating against changes to Building Regulations Part L

Tom Foster, senior product manager at Saint-Gobain Isover, considers the issues house builders and developers should look out for to ensure the work they undertake continues to meet Building Regulations standards

he updated Part L of the Building Regulations (Conservation of fuel and power) will come into effect in April 2014. Its stricter energy efficiency requirements for new buildings are expected to deliver savings of £16 million to businesses and homes each year and reduce carbon dioxide emissions by more than six million tonnes.

The government is committed to reducing the

carbon footprint of new homes by six per cent, and non-domestic buildings by nine per cent, leading them to change current building codes concerning energy efficiency. The new Part L will grant flexibility regarding how this target is to be achieved, but the updated guidelines will highlight the importance of optimising the building fabric itself to boost thermal insulation to reduce energy-intensive central heating needs.

In future, builders will also have to take into account the energy consumption and maintenance requirements of the infrastructure of commercial and industrial buildings, such as air conditioning and lighting replacements to further lower the impact of such spaces on the environment.

The new Building Regulations are necessary to help the UK's housing market achieve government targets for zero carbon emissions.

Under the updated standards, developers have a lot of freedom to choose the most suitable products for their needs.

It is important that they look at all of the solutions available to them to ensure their work complies with regulation and offers the best performance for their customers.

In the next few months the government will be releasing more details about the calculation methodologies and new targets for fabric energy efficiency. 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The drive towards electric transport

Environmental concerns, coupled with the rising cost and insecurity of fossil fuel supply have forced evolution in the way homes, public buildings and workplaces are designed and built. These same concerns are now affecting the way people view transport. But how does this affect the developer? Steve Large, technical director at electric vehicle charging specialist POD Point, explains

lectric motoring is now well on the way to mainstream acceptability and all Imajor motor manufacturers now have an electric or hybrid car in their ranges. Electric or hybrid electric cars are the fastest growing sector in UK vehicle sales. The factors driving this growth are: lower motoring cost; cleaner motoring; and tax breaks and subsidies.

Although the case for electric cars is compelling, they are a new and highly disruptive technology, and for these reasons, the infrastructure required to charge electric vehicles will precede their sales.

The UK is pursuing a two-pronged approach to develop the infrastructure for charging electric cars: centrally administered grant funding for charge point installation, and the local agenda which is determined by clean air policies, aggressive carbon reduction targets, and transport policies that actively favour electric transport.

Providing electric vehicle charging facilities can help councils meet these targets, and in many areas, can help with planning permission. Charging facilities for electric cars are usually positioned close to, or within, buildings or onstreet in an urban environment. So what are the options for developers?

There are two types of charging solution for



stationary charging - wall mounted charge points and street charging posts.

The decision about whether to install charging posts or wall-mounted charge points will be influenced by the amount of time drivers are likely to stay in a particular location, and the number of cars that need to be charged.

Electric vehicle charging infrastructure is a mandatory requirement for any development in the Greater London area that requires planning permission, including residential developments.

The London Plan states that 20 per cent of car parking spaces must have designated parking and charging for electric vehicles, with a further 20 per cent having passive provision meaning that the electricity supply must be in place so that EV charging facilities can be fitted in future. The result of this is that developments within Greater London will need an EV charging strategy to gain planning permission.

Electric vehicle charging is often an afterthought for developers, who typically calculate electrical capacity before considering EV load. However, locations with multiple charging points may exceed the peak load if the electricity is from the same supply as the building.

Electric vehicles can draw 7kW each, and the peak times for charging usually coincide with times when the building's supply is closest to its peak - early evening for domestic situations.

In the worst case scenario, overloading the mains supply to a building could result in a power cut and maintenance work would be required to re-establish supply.

Charging points can be connected through an online management system that will automatically balance the load between the building and the cars parked close by. These are communicating charge points, which connect to a load balancing system through a mobile phone signal. The load balancing system can be programmed to estimate how close the building is to its peak load and adjusts the amount of electricity supplied to cars that are plugged in to charge.

The increasing importance of eco-credentials in sale and resale has stimulated many developers to install EV charging facilities in new housing developments.

Berkeley Homes installed charging posts at the Royal Arsenal Riverside development in London. The posts were added to an open charging network, so any residents who wish to use the posts simply need to join the network. On-going user management and customer service is provided by POD Point, removing the concern of charge point owners about handling customer enquiries.

Ward Homes, part of the Barratt Group, has recently started offering home charging units in their new homes. The Sholden Fields development in Kent, completed earlier this year, provided home charging units optional extras, which could be requested by new home owners and fitted before the occupancy. First social housing in Square Mile since 1970s unveiled

eys to the first social housing built in the Square Mile since the early seventies were handed over to their new tenants today at the Middlesex Street estate in the City of London (pictured).

The twenty-four flats, built by United House, are the first of eighty-five new homes the City of London Corporation is providing for Londoners across the capital over the next eighteen months, after investing £7.5 million in the Middlesex Street development. In total the City Corporation aims to deliver 237 new homes by the end of 2016, which represents over 10 per cent of its current housing stock.

The project includes an innovative community centre and library complex where the residents are able to enjoy modern IT facilities alongside traditional library services, and to take part in teaching and adult-education programmes like entrepreneurship and employment skills courses. There is also a multi-use community hall for youth activity clubs, health and fitness classes – including pilates, yoga, and

circuit training – and a public advice and guidance service run by nearby Toynbee Hall.

The event, held at the estate's Artisan Library, was hosted by the Reverend Dr Martin Dudley, chairman of the City Corporation's Community & Children's Services Committee which commissioned the project (pictured, on the left).

National housing standards must allow local authorities to innovate

he government has recently published a housing standards consultation proposing changes to how areas including accessibility, space standards, security, water efficiency and energy efficiency are dealt with through both building regulations and planning policy.

It says that the changes proposed would be a "radical reform of the framework of building regulations, guidance, local codes and standards, which aimed to reduce bureaucracy and costs on housebuilders – supporting growth while delivering quality, sustainability, safety and accessibility".

The document suggests that government is "minded at this stage to group the standards proposed in this consultation into a simple, short, 'nationally described standards' document that will reduce cost and complexity for housebuilders".

Responding to the consultation, Dr Hugh

Ellis, TCPA chief planner said:

"The TCPA understands the government's ambitions to simplify and consolidate national housing standards and offer certainty to the private sector across local authority boundaries. However, we must ensure that these still deliver for the long term economic, social and environmental well-being of communities. The Association wishes to see robust standards that individual local authorities can innovate upon, not be limited to. For example, the on-site renewable energy requirement for new builds set out in the 'Merton Rule' demonstrate how a local authority can pioneer new ways of working to deliver a low carbon economy above and beyond that offered by national government guidance.

"The TCPA would also like to see the specific proposal of optional space standards made mandatory – rather than chosen from a standards 'menu' – to enable homes to be built that people can comfortably live in, provide storage and be readily adapted for improved accessibility."

In normal smoke ventilation mode, if a fire is detected by building's smoke sensors, the SHEVTEC roof mounted fan sets will operate while staircase vents and smoke vents located on the fire floor will open, enabling up to 5m³ per second of smoke to be drawn through the extraction shaft and provide a smoke free escape route for residents.

When operating in 'natural environmental ventilation' mode temperatures are monitored by ceiling mounted sensors in each lobby served by the smoke shafts. If the temperature exceeds a pre-determined set point a roof mounted environmental ventilation fan is activated, which vents the warm air and replaces it with cooler air from outside.



Finally filling the funding gap

I ince the credit crunch began some five

years ago, the availability of funding

across the board has reduced dramatically

as a result of the major banks' withdrawal from

markets and their need to reduce loan exposure

and loan book sizes in many areas.

a purely financial nature - speed of decision making, proven ability to perform and people who truly understand property and its idiosyncrasies should all play their part in matching the most appropriate form of funding to any

This funding gap has started to be filled by "Navigating through the numerous new lenders, with sources of new funds coming from a variety of entities that myriad of options available include private equity, corporate and institutions.

However, such sources, while relatively numerous, collectively result in a small quantum of funding when compared to the sheer volume of funding that was freely available pre-crash. That is not entirely a bad thing, given that it was the absolute volume and easy availability of credit of all types at unsustainable levels and low cost to borrowers that fuelled the boom and partially created the problems in the first instance.

Indeed, the market is clearly attempting to balance itself with the volume of transactions that are viable and also substantially reduced in quantum. Therefore one needs to be careful not to simply focus on just one side of the equation - i.e. volume of lending.

This has been highlighted by the obstacles encountered by some new non-bank lenders who have had difficulty in deploying the volume of funds they anticipated within the timescale needed to ensure the return on funds needed.

The variety of lenders that are in and entering the funding market has resulted in a very fragmented market with a broader range of finance types and options available for developers than for some time. These fall broadly into the following categories although within each group there are a wide range of terms and costs. Indeed, the costs are not always apparent to the uninitiated and may not necessarily be of

Senior debt

given situation.

This is primary funding secured on a first charge basis against the asset, normally with limited recourse to the principals by way of directors' guarantees etc. The typical level of senior debt available equates to 55 per cent of the Gross Development Value of a scheme, often equating to around 65-70 per cent of total costs. Interest rates vary from base +3.5-5 per cent, with many banks applying a minimum rate of 7 per cent per annum. In addition, commitment fees of 1-1.5 per cent and exit fees of 1-1.5 per cent are fairly standard.

Mezzanine finance

This is generally provided by a specialist lender and sits on top of the senior debt facility. The loan is secured by means of a second charge over the asset combined with limited recourse by way of guarantees from the borrower. The cost of this funding is typically 25-30 per cent per annum to reflect the higher level of risk associated with such lending. Loans are generally available up to 70 per cent of Gross Development Value (when combined

with senior debt) taking total funding up to 90 per cent of total costs. This can substantially reduce the equity required from a borrower and increase the return on that capital invested, assuming a project performs as expected.

Stretched debt

A number of lenders are providing a 'stretched' or enhanced debt facility that provides a combination of senior debt and at least a portion of mezzanine, typically up to around 85 per cent of total costs. The costs of this are generally around 15 per cent per annum through a combination of fees and interest.

Equity/joint venture

This is scarce compared to the other categories but there are a limited range of options that can provide joint venture type funding for developers wishing to take advantage of opportunities they have but where existing capital is fully committed to other schemes. Costs of any funding of this nature can vary substantially dependent on the risk profile of the project but typically borrowers should expect no more than 50 per cent of profit from a project if a partner is taking the full financial risk.

The most critical common thread between all aspects of funding in the current market is the track record and experience of the borrower. This is of paramount importance to all lenders and, in our experience, the most successful developers are those with a very focused approach in terms of geographical location and/or nature of projects undertaken.

Lenders realise that all parties involved in projects have to use their best judgement, supported by professional advice as appropriate, in terms of likely sales values that can be achieved for the product and that many factors outside anybody's direct control can affect this. However, the risk of having a completed product delivered should be mitigated by working with developers with appropriate experience and proven ability to deliver similar quality schemes.

From the borrowers' perspective, when assessing the funding options that might exist for a scheme, one key aspect is for developers to ask themselves what is most important to them in a funding structure - i.e. is it ultimate cost of funding or reducing the equity they are required to invest to ensure they have adequate capital available to spread across other opportunities, acquire options, bring new schemes through planning etc?

In conclusion, funding is available for borrowers and projects of appropriate strength but navigating through the myriad of options available is probably more challenging for borrowers than it has ever been. The structuring of the most appropriate funding solution for projects has never been more important for all involved to ensure success for all parties involved.

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

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

Advances in warm air heating technology

By Glenn Page, managing director of Johnson & Starley

The domestic heating industry faces a huge challenge. In the UK, the overall level of energy consumed is of the order of some 1,500 TWh and of this total, heat energy accounts for almost half (46 per cent) at around 700 TWh. The domestic sector consumes over half of this heat energy (385 TWh). Concurrently, there are incentives to facilitate improvements in thermal efficiency and control - such as the Green Deal, Energy Companies Obligation (ECO) and, eventually, the Renewable Heating Initiative (RHI). There could also be some penalties if demand reduction through thermal efficiency is not achieved.

Fortunately, there are some innovative heating products and technologies already available to facilitate the thermal efficiency drive, which can be built into highly efficient systems by specialist manufacturers and suitably qualified and Registered Installers.

In the area of warm air central heating, condensing technology is now available and has the facility to provide domestic hot water (DHW). Existing warm air heaters with a DHW facility typically had a 3.5kW output (some up to 6kW) circulator water heater integrally fitted within the warm air heater cabinet. The circulator water heater had its own burner and controls, but shared the same flue system as the warm air heater to evacuate the products of combustion.

To enable two separate condensing appliances in the same footprint is not practicable, but now a solution has been developed that uses one heat source to provide both the central heating and DHW - maintaining their independent usage patterns. This product also

includes features that will meet the current and ongoing requirements of UK Building Regulations and the future requirements of the ErP Directives for warm air heaters and domestic hot water production.

Condensing warm air heaters are available to cater for both the replacement of existing non-condensing combined appliances in existing dwellings and for new build dwellings to lower carbon emissions and reduce other pollutants such as NOx.

Typically, standard efficiency combined appliances were produced with the domestic hot water requirements being a limiting factor, because in larger dwellings 3.5kW of water heating capacity would not be sufficient to meet the demand or recovery time required. With the new technology, the heat available for DHW is increased significantly and will not only meet the requirements of all existing installed combined appliances, but will cater for much higher domestic hot water demands in new built dwellings.

These new heaters have the potential to be coupled with other decentralised heat sources, such as heat pump systems and district heating

systems (DHS)/heat networks. Renewable, decentralised heat sources can be highly efficient when supplying heat energy to suitable dwellings through a quality insulated distribution system, particularly in new build situations. Warm air central heating via a warm air heating interface unit (HIU), with DHW, is an efficient and cost effective way of heating dwellings on both existing and new systems. Space saving through the absence of radiators can be a significant benefit.

With warm air heating systems, another major benefit is the rapid initial heat up period, which is substantially less than half of that of wet systems. This permits certain life-style options, not easily achieved in properties with traditional wet heating systems, and can lead to additional savings in fuel consumption. Intelligent controls are now available to allow users to manage and control the usage of their warm air system carefully.







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Boiling hot selling points



When replacing a kitchen, installing a boiling water tap is fast becoming the norm in the UK. It seems a logical next step, therefore, to install one as standard in quality new homes too. Stephen Johnson, managing director of Quooker UK, believes there are benefits to the house developer of making boiling water taps part of the newbuild kitchen landscape, as they save time, energy, water and money

ncreasingly, we are told by kitchen designers that a boiling water tap is the single most enquired about new kitchen appliance in showrooms across the nation. In fact, boiling water taps are rapidly becoming the 'must have' appliance in new kitchens in the UK. This is hardly surprising as they can replace the kettle and once installed, they become the most frequently used appliance in the kitchen, being pressed into service multiple times a day.

There are a few things to bear in mind, however. When specifying a boiling water tap it is essential that you choose one that provides genuine 100°C boiling water. Anything less can

cause frustration in its owners, as it doesn't really replace the kettle. A genuine boiling tap, on the other hand, may be a small device, but has a significant impact on the homeowner's daily routine. Most people start the day with tea or coffee and just as many choose to end their day with a hot drink too. In between, boiling tap owners use their taps even more often than they would a kettle and the instantaneous delivery of boiling water saves around three minutes every time it is used. Over the course of a day, this can free up half an hour or more.

Whereas the kettle is mostly used for making hot drinks and snacks, the boiling water tap

also has a host of other benefits. For example, cleaning a wok or frying pan is simplicity itself. Boiling water cuts through grease and makes short work of washing up difficult items such as barbecue grills and oven shelves. It even helps in DIY tasks such as removing stains or getting rid of candle wax. For new parents and busy families it can also be invaluable for making up baby bottles and sterilising teats and dummies or for filling flasks and hot water bottles.

Having a boiling water tap also helps speed up the cooking process. Pans of water for boiling pasta or vegetables can be filled instantly rather than heated for ten minutes on the

hob, which also saves energy and is therefore more ecological.

It pays to specify a boiling water tap from a specialist manufacturer with its own installation team. Your property buyers not only want a good product, they will expect great aftersales service too. Boiling water taps are safe and easy to use, but do need occasional servicing. Buying from a specialist company that both manufactures and installs only boiling water taps means that the engineer knows all there is to know about the product.

If you are marketing a family home, it makes sense to ensure that the boiling water tap you specify has plenty of safety features such as a push and turn operating mechanism. An added bonus is an LED light to alert you to the fact that it's in boiling mode. Provided it has robust safety features, it will actually be safer than a kettle, as it can't be tipped over or switched on accidentally.

Some boiling water taps can also be installed with a combi system, which provides an excellent



selling point in terms of the cost of running the home. By using the cold feed only, this system provides hot water for washing up and hand washing. It does this by mixing cold water with boiling water and dispensing it from the mixer tap. This means that you run the central heating boiler less often as you don't deplete the supply from the hot tank, and you avoid

wasting both energy and water running the mixer tap until the water is hot enough to use.

Having a boiling water tap does seem to make homeowners happy and can generate a lot of good will towards the developer, creating a further point of distinction in the benefits of buying their properties over another company's.





rigin Housing, a provider of affordable housing in London and Hertfordshire, acquired the site of the burnt down Boxtree Public House in 2011 with the intention of providing social housing for multi-generational families in Harrow.

Although the area features a high number of families at risk of fuel poverty, a foremost consideration for Origin was the new building should be well received by existing residents in the Boxtree area.

YOOP responded to this concern with a horseshoe-shaped building, surrounded by a large wrap-around screen wall containing generous balconies. The sleek external finish of the building provides a distinctive outer envelope that shields the privacy of residents, and builds neighbourly respect, while the balconies provide real amenity and much-needed storage space, overcoming the likelihood of complaints from neighbours who resent seeing bicycles, toys and other household items stored on balconies.



Case study: Zero carbon ready social housing

In an age when fuel poverty appears to be a fact of life, design for social housing projects needs to be sensitive to the lifetime costs of the building, argues Gordon Evans, partner of YOOP architectural practice, which designed the zero carbon ready Boxtree social housing in Harrow

Heat retention strategy

To address concerns about fuel poverty, YOOP chose electrical heating coupled with a heat retention strategy rather than investing in renewables, which require maintenance and upgrades that add to the residents' fuel and service charge costs.

Toby Rollason of the sustainability department at YOOP explains the reasoning behind this approach: "It is important to address sustainability for the resident as well as the environment, and in the long term electricity prices are expected to remain stable compared to gas. Taking this into account, we designed a building so heat retentive that residents are only expected to turn on the heating in the coldest months of the year – if at all – which is a head on approaching to reducing fuel poverty."

Electrical heating is typically difficult to get through the Code for Sustainable Homes, and the choice of building material was paramount to compensate for the penalty that electrical heating attracts (even though electricity is getting greener year on year, so it will become greener over its lifespan).

So how was the building constructed?

Fabric first

The building envelope was made from heatretentive materials. A single skin of recycled concrete block was used as the primary structure, and this was insulated externally and render finished with a plaster inside for air tightness. This combination of materials has a high thermal mass, which absorbs, stores, and re-emits heat produced inside the building, so the walls act as storage heaters to equilibrate internal temperature.

The choice of building materials was also influenced by a consideration that is commonly overlooked in social housing – noise between flats – which can cause tensions between neighbours and resident dissatisfaction. The Boxtree development features solid internal walls constructed using building materials with high thermal insulation properties, which perform the dual purpose of heat and sound insulation.



A mechanical ventilation and heat recovery system, installed to extract heat from exhaust air and recirculate the internal gains back to into the system, provides recycling of heat that would otherwise be wasted back into the building.

With a build cost of £1.8 million the Boxtree development is now seen as a low-cost model to achieving zero carbon, by maximising the gains from the fabric before moving to more complex ingredients like micro renewable technology.

Flexible living space

Ensuring low energy costs for residents is one route to sustainability but Origin's brief included a more challenging aspect; they wanted housing that would be suitable for multi-generational living throughout the life cycle of the family.

Multi-generational living is not the usual model for social housing, but it is increasingly prevalent in the UK, with three or even four generations of one family choosing to live under

the same roof.

The building layout and amenity space needed be sympathetic with the demands of high-density living, including an older generation who may not be mobile enough to socialise away from home, and families with young (or not so young) children.

However, family units both increase and decrease in size throughout their life cycle and the YOOP design included a six-bedroom flat intended for an extended family that can easily be converted into two two-bedroom flats should the six-bedroom layout no longer be required, as well as a full wheelchair unit - a need identified by Harrow Council.

Design team

YOOP architects partnered with Sandwood Design & Build, who were the design and build contractor and specialist in delivering high quality sustainable construction techniques for the affordable housing market. Structural engineering was by Thomasons Ltd, building regulations by Butler & Young, landscape design by DCCLA, and landscape delivery by Clews Landscape Architecture.

he Lakes Estate took some time to build, beginning in around 1968 and not being fully completed until 1975. During 2012, hundreds of residents on the estate benefitted from funding to make their homes cleaner, greener, warmer, dryer and cheaper to heat.

The Lakes Community Energy Saving Project (CESP) is a £9.5 million scheme that helped partially fund vital 'eco-upgrades' to people's homes - both council houses and privately owned or rented, 2- or 3-storey houses and bungalows.

IKO's vital contribution to energy saving project

IKO PLC has provided 22,000 sq m of roofing material for a refurbishment project on a large housing estate in Milton Keynes

Work began on the major upgrade to the 469 council homes in March 2012, which could lead to them becoming up to 47 per cent more energy efficient (based on BRE study 2013). The scheme is mainly funded by Milton Keynes council with power giants npower providing grant funding that they earn based on the amount of carbon savings realised by installing the 'eco-upgrades'.

The refurbishment of the properties includes a 'warm roof', which replaced the un-insulated roof spaces, new double glazing, insulation of lofts and cavity wall insulation, application of new insulated wall cladding and replacement of inefficient central heating systems.

For the warm roof, IKO's Guardian Ultra prevENt System was installed by IKO's approved roofing contractor Oxford Asphalt. This incorporates Systems S-A Underlay, Enertherm ALU

PIR Insulation (an upgrade on the existing to achieve a revised U-value of 0.18W/m2K.), Challenger 180 Sanded Underlay and Ultra prevENt Torch-on Cap Sheet. New IKO Superlite roof lights and IKO refurbishment outlets were also installed and IKO's Rubershield-Light breather membrane was used within the wall cladding.

Cllr Peter Geary, Cabinet Member for Housing & Community, said: "Residents of the estate who have already invested in warm roofs say how much warmer and comfortable their houses are than previously, and how much money they are now saving on their annual fuel costs..."



The spiral staircase was required to allow light to emit through the home as it stands in front of large windows with the timber treads matching the first floor flooring. Individual glass panels were fixed to the stainless steel spiral handrail producing the required transparent balustrade, while the similar fixing method was also used on the exterior balcony balustrade. The final result presented a beautiful, contemporary feel matching the elegant, high quality interior furnishings within the property.



Pushing the envelope for affordable housing

Ever since the industry embarked upon the journey to deliver sustainable homes, the debate has raged on what is the most sustainable way to build in the housing sector. Without question, the affordable housing market has always given a greater nod to sustainable building methods than private developments, but according to Ian Loughnane, managing director of Prestoplan, housing developments are changing and with that change comes new construction challenges. So where does that leave sustainability?

et's be clear, there are many different ways to deliver a sustainable home and Ithere isn't a one size fits all solution sitting on a designer's shelf waiting to be used, it's about finding the solution that fits the particular project. While the economic landscape for affordable homes has changed dramatically in the last five years, a much more interesting and challenging construction environment has emerged. This change is centered around the provision of sustainable 'communities', the building of homes, leisure and retail in one space.

While the outcome is a far more appealing and engaging proposition for the families that live in these 'pop up' communities, the balance to deliver highly sustainable structures that can be designed and erected amongst accommodation that is partially occupied is far reaching.

In typical affordable housing schemes, sustainability has always been high up the priority list. In simple terms, as long as the developer can build a home that feels ambient on the inside and stands up to the rigours of Building Regulations, then the structure has done its job. A bonus timber frame systems delivers for developers is that high performance wall sections can be much slimmer than other systems, this allows for a better use of the footprint, "The argument for a more sophisticated, robust envelope is clear in terms of the delivery of reduced on site labour and waste." helps optimise room sizes and reduce foundation costs. On larger schemes, this can generate some impressive cost savings.

Increasingly we are seeing a change in 'the typical housing scheme' there has been a proliferation of more complex and varied schemes that often contain a mix of residential, office space and retail units. This is where we can offer the significant benefits of better yields, with land owners trying to maximise every square inch of their site, eliminating unnecessary costs and waste and indeed keep the delivery of the scheme on target.

The successful timber frame manufacturers are those that are developing affordable homes that contain many of the materials that would be applied on site such as insulation and plasterboard - a true off site solution. Just eliminating these two materials alone from onsite fixing operations can significantly reduce onsite labour costs and because the material is carefully measured out for each panel, waste is virtually eliminated. Crucially on sites where part of the development is occupied it's essential to keep the delivery and movement of materials to an absolute minimum.

The argument for a more sophisticated, robust envelope is clear in terms of the delivery of reduced on site labour and waste. Equally, the envelope can play a pivotal role in enabling the contractor to keep a build on schedule. This is certainly the case for many schemes up and down the country. 
a vast impact on waste mitigation, reduced on site labour costs and programme delivery. But generally mixed used schemes come with the additional risk management challenges of constructing residential accommodation in close proximity to retail and leisure facilities. One of the key issues is limiting the noise transfer between retail and living accommodation, both during construction and post completion. It's essential that the system used can easily deal with these issues without compromising design, or indeed result in the costly addition of design modifications further down the line. Equally the timber frame also needs to comply with the stringent requirements of HSG168 which sets out to protect construction sites from fire. Without question the external envelope plays a vital role in delivering high levels of fire protection but it's essential contractors chose a system that complies with the requirements of the HSE."

The efficiency and functionality of the building envelope can have far reaching benefits beyond sustainability and can deliver significant programme and budget benefits. These aren't utopian ideals, we can and do deliver against them.

Triton, which won the PCA's Innovation and Sustainability Award for the pioneering subscription of its systems to the new NBS BIM Library, supplied the waterproofing system components. These included 1,000m2 of cavity drain membranes, which were installed to the inner surface of all exterior walls, Aquachannel drainage conduit, which was installed to the perimeter and associated sumps and pumps. The design of the drainage system was based on a gravity feed to existing outlets. Together these components provided an effective Type C waterproofing system as defined by BS 8102. The system was installed by Preservation Treatments, winners of the PCA's Contractor of the Year Award. Preservation Treatments will also carry out external waterproofing works in the new build section of the development later in the project.



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
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
